This spring marked the 38th anniversary of the founding of Colorado Health Network. In 1983, with only 17 documented cases of AIDS in Colorado, a group of volunteers came together with a desire to do something to help. The group founded CHN and registered the trade name of Colorado AIDS Project (CAP).

Initially, CAP's services consisted of a fledgling food pantry, a part-time case manager, and a volunteer "Buddy" program. The initial annual budget was less than \$50,000. At the time, CAP existed to provide support to those living with HIV, share any new information about HIV as it was being discovered, and often times provide a place for clients to die with dignity.

Over the course of the next six years, SCHN (SCAP), NCHN (NCAP) and WCHN (WCAP) were also formed. Thirty-eight years later and with remarkable advancements in treatment and care, we celebrate that HIV positive people in treatment and care have nearly the same life-expectancy as anyone does.



Part of this celebration for many years has been the annual AIDS Walk, now known as the Festival for Life 5K Walk and Run. This year's festival will be a hybrid event with a virtual Walk and Run, on-line programing, wrapping up with an in-person Festival being held on Saturday, August 21 in Cheesman Park in Denver. 



National Hepatitis Testing Day (May 19)





are picking up for someone else, so it feels good to support people who are supporting people. Demographics have waivered a bit through the pandemic, so Bob V. is working hard to collect current demographic data.

SCHN Americorp Vista member Patrick is making progress on a destignatizing campaign. The effort to supply test strips in headshops is underway and a meeting with the Rocky Mountain Sexworker Coalition is on tap. Christine is meeting with the CSU-Pueblo nursing department to line up potential volunteer opportunities. Sarah is working with COVID-19 vaccine efforts to connect clients in Pueblo with

vaccines.

HEALTH ACCESS PROGRAM UPDATE

- Did you have a plan in 2020 through Connect for Health Colorado? If so, you can get your taxes done for free through H & R Block (if your income is below 400% FPL) This is only available through specific locations, and not on a walk-in basis. To schedule your appointment, call 303/320-0026. This service is unfortunately not available for clients that had employer based insurance, Medicare or Medicaid in 2020. If you had a Connect for Health/ Marketplace plan in 2020, you are required to file federal taxes for 2020.
- If you have a current plan through Connect for Health, you may receive a premium invoice with a new amount due. Please bring a copy of your new premium invoice to your case manager or insurance coordinator as soon as possible so we can adjust your premium payments moving forward.

Connect for Health has extended their Special Enrollment Period until at least August 15th, 2021. If you are uninsured, contact your case manager or insurance coordinator as soon as possible to set up an appointment to get yourself enrolled in insurance.
