In 2023, for the first time in memory, Pikes Peak Pride in Colorado Springs will take place prior to Denver PrideFest. Pikes Peak Pride 2023 will take place Saturday and Sunday, June 10-11, at Alamo Square Park (Pioneer Museum), 215 S. Tejon Street in Colorado Springs.It is a community event that annually gathers thousands of visitors together from across the Pikes Peak region into downtown Colorado Springs. There will be two full days (10 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day) of vendor booths, food trucks, a beer garden, and high energy entertainment to include the traditionally fabulous parade on Sunday. Pueblo Prevention Update

In the month of April, Prevention Services Coordinator Jefferson Campos completed his testing training, observations, and is now fully testing on his own. This was just in time for us to begin bi-weekly pop-up testing at CSU-Pueblo's Wolfpack Wellness Center. Working collaboratively with Statewide PrEP Coordinator Lead Auston Carlson, Pueblo Prevention staff will be on site at the Wolfpack Wellness Center every other Wednesday from 10am-3pm to provide free, confidential, and affirming STI testing and sexual health counseling.

With two Wednesday's under our belt in April, we learned a lot and saw 14 students receive testing services with one PrEP referral. We anticipate a busy Fall semester with this new venture and are excited to increase sexual health access and education within our CSU-Pueblo community.

Prevention staff also begin providing walk-in testing during Syringe Access times (T-Th, 10-12 & 1:30-4) with a goal of increasing testing among our participants who inject and/or use drugs. As the Drug User Health Hub team continues to integrate into programming and build out their network of referrals, we hope to collaboratively work to lessen the barriers to confirmatory testing and treatment of Hepatitis C and more.

In the last week of April, Coordinator James Wyatt provided harm reduction presentations to a Personal Health class at CSU-P that facilitated engaging dialogue among the students and faculty in each class. We look forward to Coordinator Kyle Meltzer providing companion lectures on Sexual Health & STI Prevention for her third semester in a row! Pueblo Prevention looks forward to a busy summer season!
