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MARCH 10TH IS WOMEN AND GIRLS HIV/AIDS AWARENESS DAY

HIV incidence is one of the six "Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S." indicators. HIV incidence refers to the estimated number of new HIV infections in a given year.

In the U.S., about 23 percent of people living with HIV are women and women have made up about 18 percent of new diagnoses the past few years. The highest number of new diagnoses were among women ages 25 to 44.



Fortunately, advances in testing, treatment, and prevention have resulted in progress towards the nation's goal to end the HIV epidemic by 2030.

Be on the lookout for a discussion about advancements and work within the HIV medical community and SCHN's prevention impact on local communities.

NATIONAL NATIVE HIV/AIDS AWARENESS DAY IS MARCH 20TH

National Native HIV/AIDS Awareness Day was first observed in 2007. This day is observed on the first day of Spring each year, so the 2025 observance will be March 20th.

The National Native HIV Network plans the observance each year. The observance is a national mobilization effort designed to encourage Indigenous people of the United States, Indigenous people of Alaska, Indigenous people of Hawaii to become educated, get tested, engage in prevention, and seek treatment for HIV.

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HEALTH ACCESS UPDATE - INSURANCE ENROLLMENT FOR 2025

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If you do not have insurance for 2025, you have one last chance to enroll into coverage on Connect for Health Colorado by completing your taxes. If you do not have medical insurance coverage for 2025, please contact your Health Access Program Coordinator or send an email to insurance@coloradohealthnetwork.org.

Our team can help walk you through the steps to take advantage of this last opportunity to enroll into medical insurance coverage for 2025. If you do not complete an enrollment with the Health Access team, you will not have medical insurance coverage for rest of 2025. Please do not delay getting in touch with the Health Access team to complete a 2025 enrollment.

If you have already completed an enrollment with the Health Access team for your 2025 medical insurance on Connect for Health Colorado or Colorado Connect, please send a copy of your premium invoice to your HAPC or insurance@coloradohealthnetwork.org.

LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LEAP) GOES UNTIL APRIL 2025

The Low-Income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP) starts on **November 1st, 2024** and runs through April 30th, 2025. LEAP is designed to help eligible low-income households with winter home heating costs and is available to all individuals meeting certain financial guidelines.

If you applied last year, you should have received the 2024-25 application in the mail. If you did not apply last year and would like to apply this year, your SCHN case manager can mail you an application or you can call **1-866-432-8435** to receive an application.

LEAP does not pay the entire cost of home heating. If qualified, you will receive a one-time payment. For additional information, call the toll-free LEAP telephone number listed above.

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PUEBLO WELCOMES NEW OVERDOSE PREVENTION COORDINATOR!


